Collections of Essays, articles, stories, extracts from books, reviews, letters:--

Easily the best collection is <u>Orwell and Politics</u> edited by Peter Davison (Penguin Classics, pb, 2020). 516 pp. Davison is a leading scholar of Orwell. His selection here is outstanding. However the font is too small for comfortable reading, and the footnotes – there are many – are microscopic. Available on Amazon for \$16.57 new and \$6.45 used. I don't believe it is available as an e-book. It is not available on Mainecat.

More obtainable and more readable is <u>The Orwell Reader</u> introduced by Richard Rovere (Harvest pb, reissued many times, most recent 1984) 456 pp.

Both of these collections include the essay "Politics and the English Language" (1946) and a substantial extract from <u>The Lion and the Unicorn</u>: <u>Socialism and the English Genius</u> (1941)

Orwell lived during the long age when letters were the principal form of written communication and a genre of literature themselves. Peter Davison has edited an extensive collection of letters to and from Orwell in <u>George Orwell: A Life in Letters</u> (2010). 524 pp. Davison's excellent annotations make this in fact an outstanding biography of the adult Orwell. Available to purchase but not in Mainecat.
